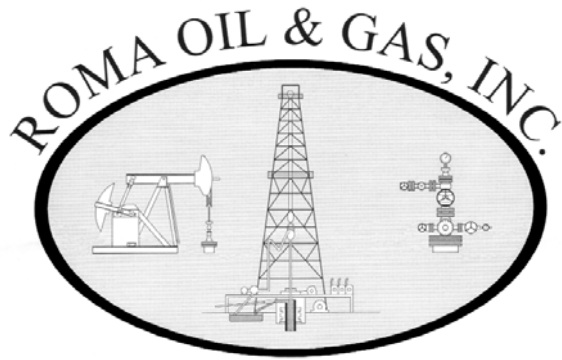

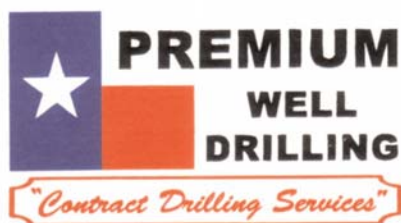

Speaker: Bob Tippee

Bob Tippee has been editor of the *Oil & Gas Journal*, a weekly trade magazine, since January 1999. He has written on all aspects of the international petroleum industry, with special interest in economics, energy policy, seismic technology, and the Middle East. His editorials for the magazine have won awards from the American Business Press, New York Society of Business Press Editors, and Association of Petroleum Writers. He was editor-in-chief of the 1997-2001 editions of the annual *International Petroleum Encyclopedia*, an affiliate publication of *Oil & Gas Journal*.

Tippee is author of a book, *Where's the Shortage? A Nontechnical Guide to Petroleum Economics*, and coauthor of *The Natural Gas Industry: Evolution, Structure, and Economics, Second Edition*. He also is coauthor and project editor of *Gas and Power in the Developing World: A Systematic Look at Countries and Their Investment Needs*.

Bob Tippee joined the staff of *Oil & Gas Journal* in Tulsa in October 1977. A native of St. Louis, Missouri, he holds a degree in journalism from the University of Tulsa, and served as an officer in the U.S. Air Force for four years. He and his wife and two daughters moved to Houston in 1990.

John D. Wright, #2497, is a petroleum consultant with thirty-four years of diverse experience in the production of oil and gas. He holds doctorate and undergraduate degrees in petroleum engineering from Colorado School of Mines, and is currently president of Questa Engineering Corporation in Golden, Colorado, which he purchased in 1988.

At Questa he has performed evaluations and done reservoir studies on six continents. Projects include the evaluation of tight gas sands in Wyoming; operating an oil field in Russia for five years; simulating high pressure air injection in light oil reservoirs; evaluating thousands of gas wells in Colorado, New Mexico and Oklahoma; providing all the geophysical, geological and engineering support for rehabilitating the largest oil field in Myanmar; working with attorneys to draft a new petroleum law and model form contract for Suriname; and providing extensive reservoir engineering support for coalbed methane projects throughout the United States, Canada and several other countries. He has also participated as a working interest owner in drilling oil and gas wells.

From 1980 to 1988 he taught petroleum engineering at Colorado School of Mines. He co-authored the text *Oil Property Evaluation* in 1985, which has been used by most of the petroleum engineering schools in the United States. In addition to his geotechnical skills, his specialties are reservoir engineering and economic analysis. He is active in several professional societies, including SIPES, and is currently on the Society of Petroleum Evaluation Engineers Board of Directors. He is a registered professional engineer in Colorado, New Mexico and Louisiana.

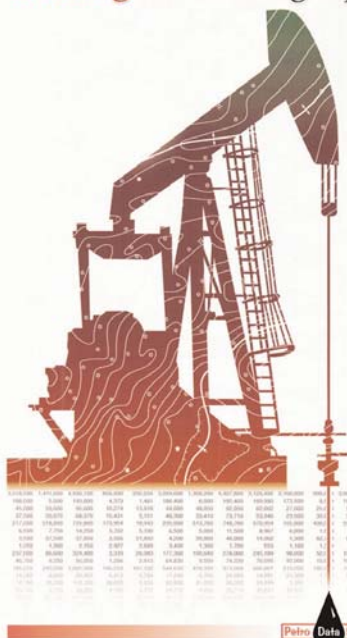

There will be two trips departing from the Plaza San Antonio Hotel on Saturday, March 20, 2003 at 8:30 a.m. Both trips will travel together on the first segment to the Dinosaur Trackway at the Heritage Museum of the Texas Hill Country. After this tour, one group will continue on to Gruene

(pronounced Green) to enjoy activities such as antique shopping, viewing arts and crafts, sightseeing, wine tasting and shopping. Lunch will be on your own.

The second group will view the model Canyon Lake Dam layout at the Heritage Museum, enjoy a barbecue lunch and continue to the dam site for an overview of the local geology.

In July 2002 approximately 22 inches of rain fell in the Canyon Lake Gorge area causing widespread flooding along the Guadalupe River. A newly-formed gorge was cut just below the dam when 700,000 acre-feet of water, at a peak of 70,000 cubic feet per second, overflowed the spillway at Canyon Lake Dam. It tossed boulders, uprooted trees, and gouged a rugged mile-long trench out of the countryside. As the water rolled up rocks, dirt and everything else in its path, it exposed millions of years of Late Mesozoic evolution in just five days!

SIPES Members will have a unique opportunity to view this natural gorge before it opens to the public. Field trippers will be able to enter the new gorge, which is 50 feet deep and several hundred feet wide in places, from the lower end. This will eliminate some strenuous climbing down from the top. There are textbook examples of slickensides, rotated slump blocks, bed attenuations at fault contacts, stairstep faulting, regional stress faults, cave fill, erosion profiles, fossil beds and natural springs - all clearly exposed for your review. Hiking boots or sneakers will be adequate for the trek. Since this is a nature preserve, leave your rock hammers home, but bring your camera.

Following the field trip, by mid-afternoon, the two groups will join at Gruene for their favorite beverage and socializing before the vans return to San Antonio.

Transportation will be provided in 15 passenger vans driven by San Antonio SIPES Members. Space is limited; please make your reservations by March 5, 2004.

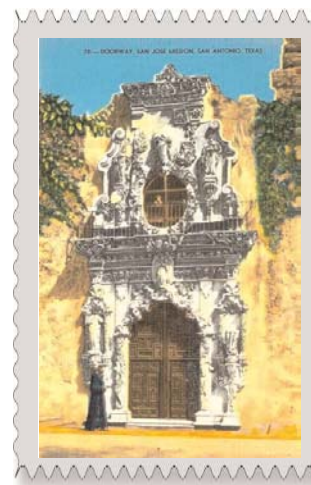
SAN ANTONIO ATTRACTIONS On Your Own

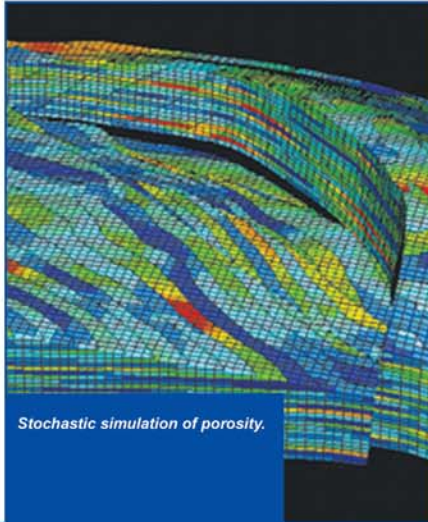

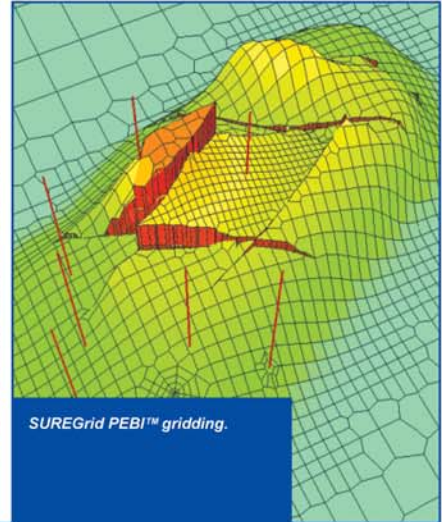
