The USS Midway's 47-Year Odyssey & Beyond

Experience the unique legacy of America's longest-serving aircraft carrier of the 20th century, and the only U.S. Navy ship to serve the length of the Cold War and beyond. A naval aviation and humanitarian mission pioneer, the USS Midway served from the aftermath of World War II through Operation Desert Storm. Today, the USS Midway Museum is the ninth most popular museum of any type in the U.S., and 22nd most popular museum of any type in the world.



Scott McGaugh is the founding (2004) marketing director of the USS Midway Museum, and was among the San Diego civic leaders who volunteered for ten years to bring Midway to San Diego in 2003. He has the unique perspective of a San Diego native who has been involved with the *Midway* vision for more than twenty years. Also an author, his most recent book, Surgeon in Blue, was a New York Times bestseller last year, and his next book, Honor Before Glory, about a Japanese-American rescue mission in World War II, will debut this fall.

San Diego: The Birthplace of Naval Aviation

What do Lieutenant Theodore Ellyson, the U.S. Navy's first aviator, Chikuhei Nakajima, founder of Japan's Nakajima Aircraft Company, and Lieutenant Commander Earl W. Spencer all have in common? They all served at aviation facilities on North Island, San Diego, California between 1911 and 1936. Rudy Shappee will present a lively narrative of San Diego's place in naval aviation history from its birth in 1911 until its maturity as the largest military base in the United States during World War II.

Rudy Shappee is a former Navy Chief Warrant Officer who, after retiring from active service in 1976, taught in various San Diego city schools, served as a vice principal, and lectured at San Diego State University over the next twenty-four years. Trained as a social historian, he joined the USS Midway Museum family in 2002, and has served as a volunteer for more than 14,500 hours in the museum's education, docent, and exhibits departments. Mr. Shappee is the author of numerous articles and books, and currently serves as the museum's special projects manager.

"Economic Trends in Capital Markets and Commodity Prices"

BY STEVE M. WYETT, BANK OF OKLAHOMA

Oil prices are impacted by many factors related not only to supply and demand, but non-oil-centric factors like currency levels which are impacted by global central bank monetary policies or international political actions. The impact of major changes in oil prices is, likewise, very broad. Steve will discuss parts of the oil price mosaic and provide the Bank of Oklahoma Financial's insights on the causes and effects of the recent oil market turmoil.

How Should We Teach Novice Geoscientists about Geoethics? BY VINCE CRONIN, BAYLOR UNIVERSITY,

GEOSCIENCE DEPARTMENT



We would all like each new generation of geoscientists to be ethical and productive members of our geoscience community. Judging by the number of geoscience organizations that publish codes of ethics or statements about standards of professional practice, it seems that ethical practice is fundamentally important to our community. Yet ethical failures persist. If we believe that ethical practice is important, why is it that we spend so little time and effort in the process of actually developing novice geoscientists as ethical scientists and professionals,

either while they are in school or during their post-graduate apprenticeships? Geoethics is virtually absent in the curricula of geoscience departments, either as a stand-alone course or as a pervasive topic in undergraduate or graduate coursework.

It seems a more intentional effort is needed, through the cooperative efforts of geoscience educators, professional societies, and mature members of the geoscience community. Written codes of geoscience ethics are a good and necessary first step, but they are not particularly effective as pedagogical tools by themselves. Case studies in geoethics engage students more effectively, allowing them to synthesize the many interwoven strands of information (technical, social, legal, etc.) that are commonly associated with challenging cases. A well designed geoethics case study is not a trivial resource to develop. Educators can help with pedagogy, but experienced professional geoscientists need to supply context and content if we are to develop relevant and effective resources for facilitating the development of novice geoscientists as ethical professionals.

Vince Cronin is a professor in the Geoscience Department at Baylor University, and is the co-chair of the US Section

of the International Association for Promoting Geoethics. His professional interests are very broad, including topics in engineering geology, earthquake geology, petroleum geology, structural geology, plate kinematics, and geoscience education. He is a Fellow of the Geological Society of America, and an award winning undergraduate educator. He is the editor of the next edition of the AGI/NAGT Laboratory Manual in Physical Geology, due out January 2017.
